NEW SCHOLARSHIPS ESTABLISHED

The following scholarships were established through the Kewanee Schools Foundation to benefit KHS students.

KHS CLASS OF 1972 SCHOLARSHIP

Members of the Kewanee High School Class of 1972 have generously established a scholarship to be used to ease the financial burden of post-high school education.

In celebration of their 50th Reunion held on October 8, 2022 at the Kewanee Elks Club, Dr. Rick Cernovich announced that the Class of '72 raised a total of \$52,592 in cash and pledges to establish the new KHS Class of 1972 Scholarship. This effort was the result of a desire by the Class to give back to the school that helped shape their lives and gave them a strong educational foundation for future success. Leading by example, it is the Class of '72's desire to challenge other graduating classes to do the same or more.

"This is the largest amount donated by any graduating class", stated Liz Breedlove, Executive Director of the Kewanee Schools Foundation. "The Foundation and Kewanee School District are sincerely grateful for the generous funds that will be available to

its graduating seniors and feel humbled that the Class of '72 has chosen to support them in this significant way."

The KHS Class of 1972
Scholarship will provide one
\$4,000 scholarship to be
awarded each year to a student
pursuing academic or skilled
trade coursework at Black Hawk
College or BHC East Campus.
The scholarship will be based
on financial need and awarded
to a student not receiving other
monetary awards. The selection
committee shall be comprised
of the Kewanee High School

administration with input from members of the KHS Class of 1972. The first scholarship was awarded at Commencement on May 21, 2023.

"On behalf of our current and future students, I wish to thank the Class of 1972 for recognizing the financial difficulties that students face as they further their education at our local community college" added Dr. Christopher Sullens, Superintendent of Kewanee Community Unit School District #229.

KHS CLASS OF 1957 SCHOLARSHIP

In lieu of the Class of 1957 60th class reunion, classmates were challenged to raise \$10,000 to re-establish the KHS Class of 1957 Scholarship. Their goal was surpassed!

The award will be given at commencement to a qualifying senior who meets the following criteria:

- Exhibits good character.
- Serious about furthering their education and that this assistance will contribute to that end.
- Preference will be given to a student who has not received other monetary awards.

P.A. HINDERLITER SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2022 by Peggy Hinderliter, Class of 1964, Peggy was a nurse anesthetist for 45 years serving the Peoria area hospitals. She retired in 2014.

The criterion to be considered in determining the recipient of this scholarship include:

- Must be pursuing a degree in the healthcare field. Preference to students pursuing a nursing career (LPN, RN or other advanced nursing degree; CNA not eligible).
- Minimum of 3.0 GPA.
- Preference will be given to a student demonstrating financial need.
- Must be a studious, hard-working student who demonstrates care and concern for his or her fellow students and the community.

RICHARD SCHIELER PERFORMING ARTS SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in 2023 from the estate of Richard P. Schieler, Mr. Schieler had a strong interest in the performing arts. This scholarship is intended for students who have participated in performing arts while at Kewanee High School including one or more of the following: theater, drama, band, choir, Group Interpretation (GI) and speech. The scholarship is intended for a student who embodies the spirit of the Kewanee High School creed which states "May the times spent here be pleasant for you, profitable for society, helpful for those you meet, and a joy to those who know and love you best."

The criteria to be considered in determining the recipient of this scholarship include:

- Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher
- Must be enrolled in a 2- or 4-year college/university or skilled trade school
- Demonstrates a true passion for theater, drama, music performance and other performing arts (e.g. Group Interpretation, speech, band and choir).



TYANDA THOMAS KINDNESS AWARD



Retiring employees include Sarah Titlow, Bob Dybdal, Kim Ellenberger, Steve Hill, Becky Henkins and Rose Schmidt. Also honored for their service was Henry-Stark Special Education retirees Christine Gustafson and Robin O'Connor.

Robert "Bob" Dybdal taught for 16 years at KCSD, as both a Title 1 teacher at Irving School and then as a Junior High Science teacher at Central School. His other activities with the school district include assistant track coach, assistant girls basketball coach, seventh grade girls basketball coach, junior high track coach and assistant golf coach.

Kim Ellenberger has worked for 24 years with the Kewanee School District. Her experience included teaching kindergarten and first grade at Central School; first grade teacher at Lyle School; second grade teacher at Irving School; fifth grade teacher at Central School and kindergarten teacher at Belle Alexander School. She also was a junior high girls basketball coach.

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

DAVID SPRAGUE - CLASS OF 1972



After graduating from Kewanee High School in 1972, Dave Sprague was not sure what he wanted to do for a living. So he enrolled at Black Hawk College East Campus, later transferring to Illinois Wesleyan University where he earned a bachelor's degree in Finance and Insurance.

After graduation, Dave began working for St. Paul Fire and Marine Insurance company as a commercial multi-peril underwriter in Atlanta, Ga. He immediately started taking evening graduate courses at Georgia State University in insurance studies. Throughout his career, Dave furthered his education whenever he had the chance, attaining three Master's Degrees: Master of Science in Industrial Studies (University of Wisconsin - Platteville); Master of Business Administration (MBA) (Drake University); and Master of Management, Federal Acquisition and Contract Management (University of Dallas). Dave also taught graduate courses part-time at two universities. To say that Dave has a love of learning is an understatement.

Dave later went to work for defense contractors including Martin Marietta Aerospace, Martin Marietta Data Systems and E-Systems (now Raytheon Intelligence and Information Systems) as a contracts manager/negotiator, where he worked in areas that included MX missiles,

satellites and software. He was also employed with Compag Computer as a contracts negotiator. While at Compag, he took a position in their Compaq.com group managing their investments in internet start-ups. Dave's experience at Compag, led to other positions at internet start-ups as a Director of Business Development. When each of those companies got purchased, he moved on to other start-ups, eventually leaving California for Virginia. In Virginia he found a job with AOL in their legal group as a contracts manager/negotiator. After a couple of years at AOL, Dave was offered a position at AOL's Co-Founder, Steve Case's new start-up Revolution Health.com. He enjoyed his position until it was bought out too. Dave was looking for a new job while helping with Revolution Health's transition and was offered a position at the Federal Reserve. While at Revolution Health, Dave reported to Ron Klain, who then served as President Biden's Chief of Staff from 2021 to 2023.

Dave spent 13 years at the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve, officially retiring on February 1, 2022. While at the Board, he worked in two different positions. He started in Acquisitions, in a position where he negotiated contracts for the Board. At the end of his first year he was awarded "The Director's Award of Excellence". He was then asked to help the Banknote Planning and Quality Control section negotiate and execute an important contract. Once the agreement was executed, the Banknote section offered him a position in the section. The small section of 18 people is responsible for everything concerning currency. By US statute, the banknotes must be printed by the US Bureau of Engraving and Printing (BEP) and the Board must pay the costs of the BEP. The Banknote section oversees the education about currency, the printing, the quality, the budget and the security features in the

banknotes. The section is also directly responsible for the transportation of the banknotes from the two BEP printing facilities to the Federal Reserve Banks. The Banknote Planning and Quality Control section has three groups. The one that Dave was a member of was responsible for overseeing the quality of the notes, the development of security features in the notes, helping to choose and purchase the large printing presses used by the BEP, and representing the Board on international counterfeit groups. Dave was the Secretary for the Counterfeit working group of the Four Nations Association. The members are made up of the Central Banks of the UK, Australia, Canada, Mexico and America, While at the Federal Reserve, Dave was in meetings with Janet Yellen, who was the Chair of the Board and is now the Secretary of the Treasury.

As you can see, Dave's impressive career included a variety of work and experiences which kept it interesting and allowed him to continue learning. Traveling all over the world for work and personal enjoyment, he also fortunately survived a few natural disasters along the way. "I don't think I personally could have ever stayed at the same job for 45 years because I always wanted to keep learning" states Dave.

In retirement, Dave volunteers at a local foodbank, a no-kill dog rescue, and also provides help to an elderly neighbor. He enjoys the company of his dog Lilly, his second Rhodesian Ridgeback. Dave credits being involved in organizations, clubs, sports and charities as helping him to develop a better, well-rounded personality, allowing him to interact with all types of people in all kinds of situations. This includes different races, nationalities, levels of society and income. The Foundation and Kewanee School District is proud of Dave and all he has accomplished in his career and life since he walked the halls of KHS.
